New Achiever Award 2018 Guidelines

Governing Statements for All Categories of Awards

- *All policies, procedures, and guidelines must be followed in order for the nomination to be considered for juried review for the award.*
- *Applicants are allowed to submit to only one award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship per year review cycle.*
- *The Awards and Recognition Committee reserves the right not to choose a recipient for an award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship if jurors do not find a worthy applicant.*
- *Recipients of the New Achiever Award are not eligible for repeated recognition.*
- *Members of the AAFCS Board of Directors or Awards and Recognition Committee are not eligible to apply during their terms of office; AAFCS staff members are not eligible to apply during their periods of employment with the Association.*

The New Achiever Award was introduced as a part of the Association's 75th Anniversary observance in 1984 when it was established to identify and honor emerging family and consumer sciences professionals who have exhibited the potential to make significant contributions to the field through their involvement with AAFCS.

Anyone chosen to receive the New Achiever Award will receive an engraved memento and a commemorative pin, which will be presented at the AAFCS Annual Conference & Expo. The recipient's name will be reported in AAFCS print and online communications.

Eligibility

Any AAFCS professional member who has earned a family and consumer sciences degree, who has been a member of AAFCS for at least two consecutive years prior to the nomination, and who has completed three (3) to eight (8) years of service to the field is eligible to receive this award. Members of the AAFCS Board of Directors and Awards and Recognition Committee, are not eligible for nomination during their terms of office. AAFCS staff members are not eligible for nomination during their periods of employment with the Association. AAFCS members can only receive the New Achiever Award once.

The award will be presented when qualified nominees are identified but to no more than five (5) recipients per year. The recipient must receive an average score of 80 points or more of the 100 points allowed.

Nomination Process

Nominations must be made by a sanctioned entity of the Association (such as an affiliate, community, committee, or unit, etc.). **The nominee is permitted to participate in preparing the nomination materials.**

To nominate an AAFCS member for the 2018 New Achiever Award, complete two steps by the second Monday in **January**:

Step 1 – Read the AAFCS New Achiever Award Guidelines.

Step 2 – Complete the following and submit them in PDF form and jpg, to awards@aafcs.org by the second Monday in January.

- A. Submit a signed letter of nomination from the affiliate president or national chair/leader of the nominating group that describes what makes the nominee outstanding. (scan, if necessary, and convert to a PDF).
- B. Curriculum vitae/resume: Three (3) page maximum, single-spaced, may use bullet form, with one-inch margins and 12-point regular sans-serif font (Arial, Tahoma, and Helvetica are some examples of sans-serif fonts), and in PDF format that has been updated within the past year. **FAILURE TO FOLLOW THIS STEP AS INDICATED HEREIN WILL RESULT IN INELIGIBILITY.**
- C. Maximum of four (4) pages of supporting materials (may include brochures; programs; photographs; newsletters; newspaper, magazine, and journal articles; complete bibliographical citations; and other relevant supporting material) that address each of the evaluation criteria listed in the guidelines (scan, if necessary, and convert to PDF). **FAILURE TO FOLLOW THIS STEP AS INDICATED HEREIN WILL RESULT IN INELIGIBILITY.**

D. **Photo of candidate:** A photograph of the candidate is requested and submission of a photograph provides AAFCS with permission to use the photography for publicity purposes. Provide photo in JPG format.

- **Submit the attachments described in A-C in PDF format, and D as a JPG image.**
- **Please submit materials in the order requested. Please use headings to identify content. All materials must be submitted must be in English.**
- **Send all required materials to awards@aafcs.org by the second Monday in January.**
- **Please keep a copy of all materials submitted to AAFCS; materials will not be returned to the nominee.**

Review Process

Jurors selected by the AAFCS Awards and Recognition Committee review the nominations and assign points using the Evaluation Criteria (see section titled *Evaluation Criteria*). Individuals who are nominated for the AAFCS New Achiever Award and those who nominate or write a letter of recommendation for a current nominee cannot serve as jurors for this award. Additionally, jurors cannot judge nominations from family members, their current students, students at their own institution, nominees who have the same employer, or any nominee for whom there may be a potential conflict of interest. An individual who has been nominated and/or applied for an award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship shall not serve as a juror for any award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship during the period of time in which his or her own nomination or application is being judged.

Award recipients will be announced in the spring of the year awarded. The Awards and Recognition Committee will do everything in its power to contact all the applicants to notify outcome of submission, however, if you have not been contacted by the end of April, it is safe to assume that you are not one of the awardees.

Evaluation Criteria

Nominations will be evaluated using the point system outlined below and can be awarded no more than 100 points.

Guidelines, as to what jurors may consider for each criterion, are listed for clarity in preparing the nomination and consistency in judging nominations.

Has initiated, developed, or participated in the development or implementation of an innovative program.	20	_____
Has contributed to the community through exemplary volunteer service using family and consumer sciences skills and background	15	_____
Is currently an outstanding professional in a traditional or non-traditional family and consumer sciences career.	15	_____
Has conducted research that is particularly relevant to current issues or has applied research findings to enhance the lives of individuals, families, and/or communities.	10	_____
Has been successful in obtaining funding for training, demonstration, research, or special projects.	10	_____
Has worked cooperatively and effectively with outside agencies and groups outside the family and consumer sciences community.	10	_____
Has participated in AAFCS at state and national levels by having served on committees, held offices, participated in annual conference activities, or been involved in AAFCS Leadership Council or other AAFCS Community programs.	10	_____
Has a publication or scholarship record that reflects a significant level of professional responsibility (such as having written books, curriculum modules, or articles that have appeared in major magazines, professional journals, or other publications).	5	_____
