Dr. Gary Bradt, Author, Clinical Psychologist, Leadership Consultant, C-Suite Executive Coach, and Speaker

Dr. Bradt gained national attention in 2000 when Dr. Spencer Johnson, the renowned author of *Who Moved My Cheese? An Amazing Way to Deal with Change in Your Work and in Your Life*, chose him as the leading speaker on the message of that blockbuster bestselling book. “Cheese” gave thousands of people the chance to get acquainted with Dr. Bradt’s extraordinary ability to cut through their frustration and fear and get to the heart of the matter, delivering powerful tools that help them adapt when going through change.

Gary Bradt had established a strong following as an executive coach and speaker long before Spencer Johnson asked him to be the messenger for his groundbreaking book. He began his leadership development career in 1987 with a respected leadership development consultancy. There he helped client companies launch proven leadership strategies and transformational processes, which turned change and tough times into an opportunity to transform themselves and take performance to the next level. His mantra—adapt and ignite!—is a rallying cry for success in these tumultuous times.

Dr. Bradt earned his bachelor’s degree in psychology from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA. He earned his doctorate degree in clinical psychology from Hahnemann University and Hospital in Philadelphia, PA, which in 2007 honored him with the “Excellence in Professional Psychology” award.

Cassandra E. McConnell, JD, Deputy Assistant Director, Office of Financial Education, Consumer Financial Protection Bureau

Cassandra McConnell joined the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) as the deputy assistant director in the Office of Financial Education in August 2011. The Office of Financial Education is responsible for developing and implementing initiatives intended to educate and empower consumers to make informed financial decisions. Ms. McConnell is responsible for providing leadership and direction for the development, implementation and assessment of the CFPB’s financial education programs, policies, and systems.

Prior to joining the CFPB, Ms. McConnell served as the associate director of the Community Affairs Office at the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). In this capacity, she oversaw and directed the FDIC’s national community reinvestment, community and economic development, financial literacy, and outreach programs. She also led the FDIC’s national Minority Depository Institutions Program to promote and preserve the nation’s minority depository institutions. Ms. McConnell has held leadership positions at the Office of Thrift Supervision (OTS) and the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland.

Ms. McConnell earned her Juris Doctor from Cleveland Marshall College of Law, Master of Public Administration from Cleveland State University’s Maxine Goodman Levin College of Urban Affairs, and her Bachelor of Science from Cleveland State University.

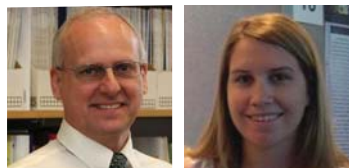

Indianapolis Museum of Art "Her-Story" Tour and "Women of Crown Hill" at Crown Hill Cemetery, 11:30am - 5:30pm, \$65.00, 4.5 PDUs

As one of the ten largest encyclopedic art museums in the United States, the Indianapolis Museum of Art gives visitors access to world-renowned collections. We'll begin the day with a tour with an IMA docent, who will share insights on "Her-story: Women Artists at the IMA." We'll then pause for lunch at the Nourish Café (www.imamuseum.org/visit/dining; cost not included in tour price). Following lunch, attendees will be free to spend time exploring the exhibits and grounds of the museum.

After exploring the museum, we'll move on to nearby Crown Hill Cemetery where we'll enjoy a walking tour, "Women of Crown Hill." On this walk through the history of Indianapolis, we'll discuss the lives of Indiana's leaders in the fight for women's right to vote, influential educators, cultural benefactors, artists, pioneers, Nancy Clem of the Cold Springs murders, and many other interesting women.

Columbus Architectural Tour, 1:00pm-6:00pm, \$65.00, 3 PDUs

Join us for a fascinating tour of the architecture of Columbus, Indiana! Prior to the tour, we'll be viewing a fifteen-minute video that details the development of the community and its architectural heritage. After the video, we'll be joined by a trained volunteer guide who will take us to the library plaza and give information about the 1969 I.M. Pei design of the library, the 1942 Elliel Saarinen design of the First Christian Church, and the 1971 Henry Moore sculpture, Large Arch. We'll then board the bus and pass by and learn about approximately 40 buildings and see landscapes designed by Michel Van Valkenburg, public art by Dale Chihuly, Henry Moore, and Jean Tinguely. After the tour, spend an hour exploring downtown Columbus! Visit historic landmark Zaharakos Ice Cream Parlor and Museum, an institution since 1900; check out Jean Tinguely's sculpture, *Chaos*, in the Commons; or just see what shopping Columbus has to offer!
